North Curry Parish Council

Grit Bins: The Parish Council has been asked on a number of occasions to provide grit bins in various key locations in the Parish. It is considering a scheme whereby local groups get together jointly to contribute towards the partial funding of a bin for their location. Bins are provisionally estimated to cost about £200 and the Parish Council would contribute around 50% of this cost with residents funding the balance. The bins would become the property of the Parish Council. The grit would be replenished by the County Council and it would bear the cost. Grit would only be for use on the public highway i.e. not to be used for private drives and paths, and this would be monitored by the Council. Residents would be expected to distribute the grit themselves when the need arose. The scheme would initially be limited to six locations. If you are interested then write before the end of April to the Parish Clerk giving details of your group leader, group members and proposed location.

New Bus Seat: Parishioners will be pleased to see that the Parish Council has completed the construction of a new bus seat at the junction of White Street and Stoke Road. This was partially funded by the County Council, the balance coming from the Parish Council.

Annual Parish Meeting: A reminder that this year's APM will take place at 7:30 pm on Wednesday 4^{th} May in the Village Hall. In addition to presenting the Chairman's Report and Annual Accounts it is hoped to discuss, amongst other things, the plans for the Queen's Diamond Jubilee – 2012.

Members & non-members are all welcome.




North Curry Amateur Gardeners


