Annual Parish Meeting: A final reminder that this year's APM will take place at 7:30 pm on Wednesday 4th May in the Village Hall followed by free coffee. The Chairman will be presenting his Annual Report and the Annual Accounts will also be presented. Mrs. Sarah Loader, the new Head Teacher of North Curry Primary School is also expected to address the meeting.

Amongst other things, the plans for the Queen's Diamond Jubilee – 2012 will be on the agenda. This is your opportunity to influence the selection of a permanent memorial to mark this event and also to discuss other aspects of the Jubilee Year such as the celebratory events that might be organised.

Elections: You are reminded once again that the election of a new Parish Council will take place on 5th May alongside the District Council elections.

Additional Councillors: As a result of the fact that only 10 candidates are standing for 13 seats in the election, the Council may use its powers to co-opt additional members to fill the three vacancies that will arise. This will take place at its first meeting on 11th May. 


North Curry Luncheon Club
