The Parish Council would like to wish all Parishioners a happy, healthy and prosperous New Year.

Pink Newsletter: We would like to thank the producers and distributors of the monthly pink Newsletter for their hard work during the past year and also those organisations who kindly sponsored editions.

Christmas Tree: The Parish Council would like to record their thanks to Alison and Noel Prosser of North Curry Post Office and Stores for supplying and erecting the Xmas tree in Queen Square again this year.

New Bridge: The Parish Council have received some complaints regarding the safety of New Bridge and are aware that there have been a few minor accidents there. We are working with SCC Highways Department to look at signage to improve the situation but if Parishioners have any suggestions as to how they think safety could be improved at the bridge please let the Parish Clerk know so that they can be considered.

Severe weather waste collection advice: We have been informed by Somerset Waste that in severe weather, recycling and refuse crews will try to keep collecting if it is safe. If your collection is missed they will try to return once conditions improve, working late and on Saturdays to catch up. They ask that recycling and refuse be put out by 7am for the next three working days; if it is not collected by then, please take it back in and put out by 7am on your next usual collection day.

They say that if your collection is delayed, extra amounts of regular waste will be accepted: please put rubbish in black sacks, recycling in carrier bags and food in covered buckets or in black sacks with other rubbish. In very bad conditions, garden and bulky waste collections may be suspended to give priority to the main services. If the clinical waste service is interrupted, they will get back as soon as possible.

As mentioned last month, we are planning an expansion of our Food Yards project which, if it takes off, we intend to call "Fruits of Athelney". This, in the first instance, will be a feasibility study to assess both potential supplies of, and demand for, local produce as it becomes available.

We aim to contact every household in the Athelney villages to canvass interest. We have already started to discuss the collection, processing and marketing of produce with prospective suppliers. To carry this out properly will require some paid work and an application to the Levels and Moors fund is being prepared. We will also need to obtain some matched funding, so if you are interested in helping a local community scheme, please remember Transition Athelney (we can obtain gift aid).

The monthly pub meetings will resume in January, with a gathering at The Rose and Crown in Lyng, 8pm on Tuesday the 17th.
