PARISH PLAN: Thank you once again for the enthusiastic response to the Parish Plan leaflets, this time in response to leaflet 3. The results will be analysed and any accompanying comments will be noted and, where possible, taken on board. The results will then be taken to Taunton Deane Borough Council in an effort to influence the scope of the Local Plan. Please note that at this stage it is only an effort to influence the areas TDBC include in the Local Plan as being open for planning applications, it does not necessarily mean that houses will be built in those places. You will be kept informed of the outcome.

CHURCH RD. LIME TREES: Please see the enclosed leaflet concerning options for the lime trees in Church Road - let the Parish Council have your views.

VILLAGE DEFIBRILLATOR: A portable, automated defibrillator is to be installed in the village for use in the case of cardiac arrest, whilst awaiting medical assistance. This is an important new village facility and if you would like to hear more and learn from St John Ambulance how to use it, come along to the Village Hall on Saturday 13th October, from 2:45 – 3:45. Our thanks go to David Fothergill, County Councillor, for his help in facilitating this initiative.

COFFEE SHOP GRANTS: The Parish Council would like to send their grateful thanks to the Coffee Shop volunteers for their generous donation towards the replanting of Queen Square garden. Planning of the work has begun and we look forward to seeing a revitalised garden next year.



How Tai Chi in later life is good for the heart: Elderly who perform exercises lower blood pressure

Practicing the ancient martial art of tai chi can boost elderly people's hearts, a study has found. Older subjects who regularly performed the traditional Chinese mind-body exercise now enjoyed worldwide were less likely to suffer high blood pressure and were physically stronger.

Researchers said a work-out which can achieve both good heart function and muscle power 'would be a preferred mode of training' for this group. Additional analysis showed that the Tai Chi subjects had greater average muscle strength especially knee muscle strength than their healthy counterparts.
