Flooding: The Parish Council extends their sincere sympathies to all those in the Parish affected by the recent floods. Sandbags: Whilst it is hoped that there won't be a repetition of the November flooding, for future reference, sandbags are available from Taunton Deane (TDBC), tel. no. 351411. The general rule is for six per doorway.

Village Newsletter: We would like to thank the producers and distributors of the Village Newsletter for their hard work during the past year, and particularly for the assistance they gave delivering a large number of leaflets for the Parish Council. Their help was invaluable and very much appreciated.

Christmas Tree: Our thanks also go to Alison and Noel Prosser of North Curry Post Office and Stores for supplying and erecting the Xmas tree in Queen Square again this year, ensuring the Christmas spirit was enjoyed by all.

Church Road Lime Trees: In view of responses to the Lime Tree questionnaire, the Parish Council took the decision to follow the majority view and carry out crown raising of the trees in early spring.

££££ Somerset Community Oil Scheme - update:

Don't forget the potential to save money when ordering oil via the Somerset Community Oil Scheme. They report average savings of 4.74 pence per litre. Membership costs £20 for the year, with orders being placed once a month (except December), and a minimum order of 500l. Dog Waste Bins: The Parish Council have agreed to install three dog waste bins in the village. Subject to agreement from Highways, they will be sited in Church Road, near the side entrance to Church, in White Street and in Greenway near the school. It is hoped dog walkers will make full use of them and the village will be a cleaner place to walk as a result.

North Curry Society are most fortunate to have Stephen Moss as our speaker on 16th January. A vicepresident of the Somerset Wildlife Trust and one of Britain's leading nature writers, broadcasters and television producers, Stephen has travelled to all seven(!) of the world's continents in search of wildlife. During a broadcasting career spanning 30 years (mostly at the world-renowned BBC Natural History Unit) he has produced many award-winning series, including Springwatch, Big Cat Diary, Birding with Bill Oddie, The Nature of Britain, and Birds Britannia. He writes a monthly column on birdwatching for The Guardian, and has written more than 20 books on wildlife, including his latest volume Wild Hares and Humming Birds, published this August in paperback.

In this book Stephen celebrates month by month the sights and sounds of wild flowers and trees, insects birds and animals as he walks and cycles round his village on the Avalon Marshes: the rooks and roe deer; sparrows and snowdrops; buzzards, badgers and butterflies; and the brown hares and hummingbird hawk-moths which give the book its title. As the English landscape and wildlife faces change, Stephen discusses the plants and animals that will adapt and thrive, and those that may struggle to survive.

The Society meets in the Village Hall at 8pm on the third Wednesday of each month (except August and December). Membership costs £5 for the year and includes a coffee or tea, and a chance to engage in further discussion with the guest speaker after the talk. Non-members are very welcome to attend, on payment of a nominal entrance charge of £1 (which does include coffee). Our annual programme seeks to explore the local history, natural history and environment of this enchanted place. At our February meeting Celia Fitzhugh will be taking a longer look at the North Curry Archives, which are fast becoming a treasure house of village memories.

As you'll know from previous articles I've been promoting free energy surveys of houses in the area during which advice on money and energy saving measures would be given. We now have available an Infra-red camera which we use to take thermal images of buildings showing where heat is being lost so highlighting areas where improvements could be made. It can even be used to check on the effectiveness of injected cavity wall insulation.
