


North Curry Amateur Gardeners

An answer to flooding?

As you might have heard, planning permission has been granted for a solar farm in Knapp where up to 1.5MW of electricity can be produced. In the grand scheme of things this will only make a comparatively small difference to CO₂ emissions but if we are serious about combating climate change we need to take personal responsibility, reducing our fossil fuel usage in our homes and lifestyles. In the long term this is probably the best way to fight flooding issues.

Why not take up our offer of a free home energy survey, including thermal images from an Infra-red camera which indicates where heat is being lost so highlighting areas where improvements could be made. It can even be used to check on the effectiveness of injected cavity wall insulation.
