#### TDBC DEVELOPMENT PROPOSALS:

The long awaited TDBC Site Allocation Plan "Preferred Options" is due to go out to public consultation from 31<sup>st</sup> October to 12<sup>th</sup> December. This document will put forward TDBC's preferred sites for development in the village. TDBC will be holding a public meeting to present the

proposals on Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> November in the Village Hall, from 3:30 – 7:00pm. The Parish Council will hold a further public meeting on Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> November from 2:30 – 4:00pm to listen to your views on the proposals. An extraordinary Parish Council meeting will then be held on Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> December at 7:30pm, when the Parish Council will consider the views expressed and prepare their response to TDBC. PLEASE ALSO MAKE YOUR VIEWS KNOWN TO TAUNTON DEANE AND RESPOND TO THEIR CONSULTATION DIRECT!! The TDBC proposals and their final decision will override the Parish Plan that was prepared, so it is imperative that you make your views known to them. If you support the Parish Plan sites, tell TDBC. If you object to any of the TDBC sites tell them. HAVE YOUR SAY!!

WINDMILL HILL PLANNING APPLICATION: At the meeting of 16<sup>th</sup> October, Taunton Deane Planning Committee followed the Planning Officer's recommendation and refused the David Wilson Homes application to build up to 45 houses on Windmill Hill. The Parish Council would like to thank all those who gave their time and expertise to prepare and present the village's representations to the Committee. This result is a step in the right direction, but it emphasises the need to respond to the TDBC consultation mentioned above to make sure that future development is in the right place and sympathetic to the village.

**REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY:** The annual Service of Remembrance will be held in Queen Square starting at 10:40am on Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> November. Residents of Queen Square and Church Road are requested to kindly ensure that vehicles are clear of the War Memorial area from 10:15am until 11:30am on that day.
