LOCAL FLOOD AWARENESS — A flood awareness help sheet is available on the North Curry Website, hard copies may also be obtained from the Parish Office. You may also wish to note that, if you drive past a flood warning sign and your car subsequently breaks down in the flood water, your insurance may be negated.

WINTER DE-ICING —There will again be a limited number of 20kg bags of de-icing material available for individuals to collect. These are for self-help use on the public highway/footways in the event of prolonged periods of snow/ice. Please contact the Parish Clerk if interested.

CHAIRMAN'S AWARD FOR SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY – The Parish Council would like to congratulate Terry Sidley, who was awarded the Somerset County Council Chairman's Award for Service to the Community. This was given in recognition of his contributions to local causes including the Community Stable, the Shandy Band and CATS (Curry Amateur Theatrical Society).

REFUSE COLLECTIONS OVER THE CHRISTMAS PERIOD — Waste collections (including clinical waste) scheduled for 25th, 26th and 27th December will take place two days later than usual (i.e. 27th, 28th and 30th Dec). Waste collections scheduled for 1st, 2nd and 3rd January will take place one day later than usual (i.e. 2nd, 3rd and 4th January). All other collections will remain unchanged. Garden waste collections are suspended from 25th Dec and will resume on 8th Jan.

Instructions for use of the defibrillator (AED) in the case of cardiac arrest

An AED (Automated External Defibrillator) is a machine that delivers an electric shock to the heart when someone is having a cardiac arrest. It can be used by anybody, training is not necessary, as the AED will diagnose whether a shock is needed, and then guide you through the process. The AED is located in a blue cabinet, next to the telephone box outside the Post Office. The cabinet is not locked and can be accessed at any time. Don't forget to call for an ambulance first so that it can be on the way while you use the AED.

- Open the cabinet by twisting the black handle and lift the AED case out. It is portable and can be taken to where the patient is.
- 2. The AED is a large blue and yellow machine, which is released by opening the case and unclipping the two side straps. (The smaller pouch has a first aid kit with scissors for cutting open clothing, as the chest of the patient must be bare.)
- **3.** Lift the AED out of the case and open the plastic cover.
- **4.** When the plastic cover is opened the voice prompt will speak and tell you what to do. Follow the instructions given.
- **5.** The patient must be on the floor, as CPR will be needed, even when the AED is used.

After the AED is used, please notify the Parish Council as soon as reasonably possible so it can be checked and made ready for use again.
