HELP ENSURE NORTH CURRY CONTINUES TO THRIVE: The Parish Council are hoping to co-opt a new Parish Councillor at the October meeting — it could be you. If you are interested in putting your name forward, or would like to know more about what is involved, please contact the Parish Clerk or speak to any of your Parish Councillors.

STOKE RD. CLOSURE — 5TH OCTOBER ONWARDS: Stoke Road is to be closed at the eastern side of the village in the area of "The Plantation", where the road has previously flooded, to allow Highways to carry out significant drainage repairs. The closure will commence on Monday 5th October and is expected to last 4-5 weeks. The road will be closed to all traffic from 9am to 3:30pm, Monday to Friday with a diversion in place via the A361 at Burrowbridge. Outside the closure times traffic flow will be controlled by lights. There is expected to be some form of access maintained for pedestrians and cyclists throughout the closure. The closure is necessary to allow the work to be completed in the quickest and safest manner and to replace the collapsing culvert before the winter weather sets in and it is hoped you will understand any unavoidable inconvenience.

TRACTOR SURVEY: Whilst fully understanding the pressures on the farming community and appreciating the need for modern farming practices, the Parish Council is aware that a number of parishioners are concerned about tractor movements in the Parish. To allow the PC to gauge the level of concern **please complete the enclosed survey**.

HELP PREVENT SURFACE WATER FLOODING - KEEP DRAINS CLEAR! It's that time of year again, if you have a drain near your house please could you keep an eye on the drain cover and clear any leaves or debris from the surface of it. This should help surface water drain more quickly and reduce flooding in the Parish.

Balzac and the Little Chinese Seamstress is based on a semi-autobiographical novel about two young Chinese boys of bourgeois background who were sent to a remote village for three years of re-education during the Cultural Revolution. They fall in love with a beautiful local girl, and the three find

solace and liberation in novels by Western authors, among whom their favourite was Balzac. The film explores the themes of youth, love, and freedom in those dark times in China.
