TDBC SADMP HEARING UPDATE: The TDBC Site Allocations and Development Management Plan, on which many Parishioners commented, is now being examined by an independent Planning Inspector. Having read the Plan, and the responses and comments, he still has outstanding questions, some of which relate specifically to North Curry. He has called a series of hearings from 30th March to 5th April. The development and uses of mediæval weapons, AD 1000-1500



On Wednesday 16th March, Neil Eddiford will be telling the North Curry Society about mediæval battle weapons. Brutal and

crude, mediæval weapons were used to cripple their opponents. Maces and clubs with spikes would completely tear the flesh off a man. Warriors and barbarians used weapons of all kinds to do battle at close range; knights would carry weaponry to protect their King, and battles would last for weeks.

Neil's talk will be an explanation of the development and uses of mediæval weapons between 1000 and 1500 AD, showing examples of what was used at the time. His interest began when he joined an archery club and he took up blacksmith work to make his own arrowheads and other artefacts. He runs his own mediæval re-enactment group and has been involved in a number of TV programmes on the subject.

Our meetings are held monthly at 8pm in North Curry Village Hall. Membership costs £5 a year; visitors are very welcome on payment of a small entrance charge. We look forward to welcoming you.







Time for Celebration

By the time you read this, North Curry Community Energy's third 10 kW solar installation should be in place, on the school roof. By the beginning of February, the other two, on the White Street pavilion and the Village Hall, had generated 2,000kWh of carbon-free electricity, in spite of the grim weather. We look forward to seeing that performance accelerating, as the days get longer and brighter; with this further array on stream this village will be a community to be envied.

You can keep tabs on the output from the Village Hall panels by way of the display in the foyer above the doorway into the main hall where you can see current output, total output in kWh and amount of carbon saved. A similar display will be installed in the School to allow children, their parents and all visitors to see the same information for that array.

We are planning an event in the spring to celebrate this achievement and to thank everyone who has played a part in it. Watch this space for details.
