

Rich men, poor men of North Curry: coffee morning

A coffee morning will be held 14th May to contribute anecdotes and stories for the next book on North Curry. Dave Patten's last book *Shops and Trades of North Curry* is nearly sold out - a few are left at the Post Office and Archives. £2,000 was raised for charity. Some 90 pages have already been written: the *Rich Men* section are the Barretts of Moredon that includes 30 photos taken around 1890 that have never been published before. Major Barrett in 1914 left today's equivalent of £52 million - and £50,000 to his cook (how the tongues must have wagged).

The rest of the book will cover farming, especially willow, and some of the largely trivial felonies committed by locals, though one was hung at Tyburn.
