NORTH CURRY TO RECEIVE SCC FUNDING FOR FLOOD ALLEVIATION WORK! As we go to press Somerset County Council is due to allocate £10,000 to survey the North Curry drainage system to identify problem areas, with a further £120,000 to deal with issues identified. It is hoped this will go a long way to improving the resilience of the area in the event of future bad weather. Grateful thanks go to County Councillor David Fothergill for all his support for North Curry.

Whilst hedge cutting should not commence until September to allow birds to fledge, where there is a safety issue the area causing a problem should be attended to without delay.

Civil Disobedience

This is advance notice that Transition Athelney will be showing its second film of the year on 22nd September. Its title is "Disobedience – the courage to break free".

Most of us probably consider ourselves pretty law-abiding, though history tells us that many social reforms have only come about because there were people willing to put their liberty and safety on the line, to challenge the existing order. The climate movement is no exception and "Disobedience" charts the contribution which civil disobedience has played and is playing, in an effort to loosen the control and destructive impact which the fossil fuel industry exerts in our world.

The Transition movement is not a campaigning one per se, but the common ground here is the knowledge that if we leave it to government to build a sustainable future, it will be too little, too late. We expect the film to evoke a range of reactions. It is only 40 minutes long, so there will be time to share our thoughts.
