CONTINUE DRIVING SAFELY FOR LONGER:
FREE PRESENTATION FOR MATURE DRIVERS
2:00 ON MONDAY 17TH OCTOBER IN THE VILLAGE HALL

There will be a free Route 60+ presentation for older drivers (although all are welcome), addressing how both vehicles and driving skills have changed over the years and offering coping strategies to take into account the increased amount of vehicles on the road and our ability to adapt our driving skills. It is hoped other agencies will also be attending including a driving simulator to test reactions, eyesight checks etc. Reports are that the presentation is interesting and helpful and there is also a free "goodie" bag for attendees so do come along on Monday 17th October at 2.00pm!

HELP PREVENT SURFACE WATER FLOODING - KEEP DRAINS CLEAR!! It's that time of year again, if you have a drain near your house please could you keep an eye on the drain cover and clear any leaves or debris from the surface of it. This should help surface water drain more quickly and reduce flooding in the Parish. If you see that the drain itself is blocked please report it to County Highways by calling 0300 123 224 and choosing the "Roads and Transport" option, or report it online at: www.somerset.gov.uk, choose the "Roads, Parking & Transport" option then "Problems on the Road".

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY, A DATE FOR YOUR DIARY: The annual Service of Remembrance will be held in Queen Square starting at 10:40am on Sunday 13th November.

TAKING A TRAILER OF WASTE TO THE DUMP? From 3rd October, anyone taking waste to the recycling sites in smaller vans, single-axle trailers of up to 3m and pick-ups will now need a permit. These are free, last three years and available online. Vans over 3.5 tonnes gross, Luton vans, agricultural vehicles and trailers with more than one axle or over 3m floor length will not be allowed to bring household waste to the sites. Access for cars remains unchanged. Visit www.somersetwaste.gov.uk for full details.


