### **Building a Church**

Our speaker this month, on Wednesday 15th March is Jerry Sampson, former president of SANHS and for almost a quarter of a century archæological consultant to conservation architects. Jerry has worked on English and Welsh cathedrals with projects at Wells, Exeter. Gloucester, Salisbury, Winchester, Rochester and Brecon as well as vernacular buildings such as Montacute House, Wells Bishop's Palace, Wilton House and HM Tower of London and has been associated with the rolling programme of conservation at Glastonbury Abbey since 1984.

Jerry has given his talk the intriguing title Building a Church. He lectures widely in Somerset for local history societies and has undertaken several projects for them investigating the structural history of their parish churches.
