BANKING AVAILABLE LOCALLY! – Do you want to withdraw money or pay a cheque in to your Barclays, HSBC, Lloyds, NatWest, Co-op or other bank account without a trip to Taunton? Get along to the Post Office, you don't need a post office account, they provide access to all the banks!

With the closure of High St. banks in towns throughout Somerset, please remember that you can pay in cheques and money in to and withdraw cash from any High St. bank account at North Curry Post Office. It is quick, easy and local, and there is no cost for these services.

(This doesn't currently include Business Accounts but services are constantly expanding so check with Alison.)

Who Benefits?

At the March market someone new to the village asked me "Who benefits from the market, what is it in aid of?"

The producers market started over ten years ago. Its main aim is to bring together various local makers/ producers who would like to sell and promote their products while raising funds for the parish church. The raffle, church produce stall and the kitchen are run by volunteers and the profit from these along with the stall rents, all go to the parish church to help with running costs.

The church needs over £1,000 a week to keep running and we manage to contribute about £2,500 a year towards these running costs.

As well as an opportunity to buy local produce, the market is now a popular social event in the village; held on the first Saturday of the month in the village hall 9:30 – 11:30am. We are always pleased to see everyone and thank you for your continuing support.

This year the May Fair is being held on the same day as the produce market so it looks like being a busy day in the village. Please don't forget to visit the market; all the usual stall holders will be there with their produce.

Maypoles and Mischief, Merrymaking and Mayhem – a history of May Celebrations

May is a special time of the year, a time for celebrations and fairs, like our own in north Curry, and for revels, riots, dancing and protest. This illustrated talk looks at the social history of May celebrations and the importance of Mayday, Whitsun and Summer Games. Richly accompanied with illustrations, paintings and photographs, recorded and live music, the talk traces how May festivities have changed and adapted through the ages, how the idea of 'may' is expressed in literature and folk song and some of the battles fought over how we celebrate. A special focus will be traditions and stories of celebrations in Somerset.

The talk is given by local musician Tim Hill. Tim has been creating and researching outdoor celebrations and music for other 25 years. He regularly talks at universities, colleges and arts conferences, and, with the Mellstock band, recreates the rural music of eighteenth and nineteenth century England, playing and appearing in radio, TV and film productions like the classic BBC Pride and Prejudice.
