Would You Like A Free NHS Health Check? Free NHS Health Check sessions are available on Saturday 30th September, 9:30 – 3:00 in the Village Hall Meeting Room. If you are aged between 40 and 74, and haven't had an NHS health check in the last 5 years, you could be eligible for a free NHS health check. Each check takes approx. 20 minutes. RAGWORT: Don't forget that ragwort is poisonous to animals both when eaten fresh and particularly when included in fodder when it is more palatable. If appropriate, please take action to remove ragwort before it seeds if you have any on your land, DEFRA provides guidance on how best to control and dispose of it.

BROADBAND VOUCHER SCHEME EXTENDED: If you were awarded a broadband voucher but thought you had missed your chance to spend it, you will be pleased to hear that the deadline for spending the vouchers has been extended to 30th September.

Dog Waste: Concern continues to be expressed about owners not clearing up after their dogs. This relates to all areas of the village but has been particularly noted along Nine-Acre Lane, where dogs are let off and may be out of sight, and also the grass verge along Church Road. PLEASE keep your dogs in sight and clean up any dog waste - bins are available, please use them!



How do you go about discovering what happened in the past? What sources can be interrogated? How much information is needed to tell a story? And how do you make that information come alive on the page? On **Wednesday 20th September** experienced authors, Marilyn Livingstone and Morgen Witzel, an Anglo-Canadian husband-and-wife writing team, will talk about researching and writing history and share insights into the historian's craft. Their books include The Road to Crécy, The English Invasion of France, 1346 and, under the pen name A.J. MacKenzie, two historical detective novels set in Romney Marsh during the 1790s. It will be a fascinating evening, and not just for budding authors!
