HELP PREVENT SURFACE WATER FLOODING - KEEP DRAINS CLEAR! It's that time of year again, if you have a drain near your house please could you keep an eye on the drain cover and clear any leaves or debris from the surface of it. This should help surface water drain more quickly and reduce flooding in the Parish. If you see that the drain itself is blocked please report it to County Highways by calling 0300 123 224 (choose the "Roads and Transport" option), or report it online at: www.somerset.gov.uk, choose the "Roads, Parking & Transport" option then "Problems on the Road".

OVERGROWN HEDGES AND SHRUBBERY: PLEASE ensure any hedges or shrubs on your property that are adjacent to paths and roads are kept cut back and do not overhang the highway or pavements/footpaths. Thank you.

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY, A DATE FOR YOUR DIARY: The annual Service of Remembrance will be held in Queen Square starting at 10:40am on Sunday 12th November.
