Musical treats for 2018 @SS P&P

On 7th March, Italian singer Roberto Tardito will be bringing songs from the Red Book of Montserrat, a 14th-century manuscript compiled and retained at the monastery in the mountains above Barcelona. The music director at Aberdeen Cathedral writes "I was attracted by his use of material from the Llibre Vermell, a mediaeval collection of pilgrims' songs similar to Carmina Burana. He has a rather unusual style, rather folk-pop".

Then on **5**th **May** our **Village Choir**, will bring us their annual Spring Concert, taking advantage of our fine pipe organ to bring you a glorious blend of instrumental and choral works.

The **Voskresenije Choir** seem comfortable about singing in the Church of Peter and Paul; the name must make them feel at home. They are returning from St Petersburg on **9**th **October** with a programme of traditional songs as well as pieces from the Russian Orthodox liturgy.



'Twas Christmas Day in the Workhouse: a talk by Ken Atherton, FRGS, FBCartS



On **17**th **January**, Ken Atherton will be returning to North Curry Society with a chilling account of conditions locally in Victorian and Edwardian times for those without sufficient means to support themselves.

Workhouse - the word alone was calculated to send a shudder down the spine of any honest 19th century worker. It signified the end of the line, the final indignity: "Abandon hope, all ye who enter here". This presentation recounts the life endured by Workhouse inmates until the system was finally ended in the 1930s. The talk uses examples from the Workhouses of Bridgwater, Taunton, Wellington, and Williton.

NCS meetings are held at **8:00pm** in the Village Hall on the third Wednesday of each month. Refreshments from **7:30pm**. Annual membership of £5 includes admission to talks, discussions and refreshments. Visitors (who pay a small entrance charge), new or established members, are all welcome.
