PARISH COUNCIL MEETING CHANGE OF VENUE: Please note that due to the Pantomime the Parish Council meeting on 14th February will take place in the Greenway Playing Fields Pavilion, starting at the usual time of 7:30pm. It will be back in the Village Hall meeting room in March.

A358 OPTIONS CONSULTATION - HAVE YOUR SAY:

Highways England are carrying out a further consultation on options for the upgrading of the A358 between West Hatch and the M5, closing on Tuesday 27th February. Public exhibitions will be held in January and February (see the noticeboard for details), the Parish Office will also hold copies of the consultation brochure and questionnaire. A361 ROAD CLOSURE: At the time of going to print SCC intend to close the A361 from 19th February for up to three weeks between the canal and Durston Elms. The closure will operate between the hours of 7:30am and 5:30pm but the road will be open at weekends. The closure is to allow a full resurfacing of the road.

DEAFPLUS VISIT: The deafPLUS mobile advisory service van will be in Queen Square on Thursday 15th February between 12:30pm and 2:30pm. If you have hearing difficulties deafPLUS provide information, advice and support so do visit them.

BE ASBESTOS AWARE: If you are planning any renovations on property (including garages) built or refurbished before 2000 you could be disturbing asbestos containing materials. These materials don't present a health risk when undisturbed but when damaged the fibres released can be inhaled and lead to severe health issues. Somerset Scientific Services (part of SCC) offer free impartial asbestos advice and also a service to analyse suspect material. 

LLIBRE VERMELL DE MONTSERRAT the old pilgrims' music



Roberto Tardito brings pilgrims' songs from the ancient Catalonian monastery of Montserrat

On Wednesday 7th March at North Curry parish church, Roberto Tardito will be bringing songs selected form the Red Book of Montserrat. Roberto was born in Ivrea (Italy) in 1984. He is now on European tour and is diverting to North Curry between concerts in Birmingham and London.

The Llibre Vermell de Montserrat is a manuscript collection of devotional texts containing, amongst others, some late mediæval songs compiled in and located at the monastery of Montserrat outside Barcelona. Roberto will give a folk-pop reworking of the pieces taken from the codex. Concert starts at 7:00pm, tickets £10 (unreserved seats) will go on sale from North Curry Post Office at the beginning of February.





Travels in the Ottoman Lands An archive discovered: diaries and photographs of Tommy Lenton's visit to the Middle East in 1912

This month on **Wednesday 21**st **February** our very own David Lenton Akerman will be describing his great-grandfather's visit to the Middle East, using extracts from his 1912 diary and original photographs of local people and archaeological sites. David's talk will be followed by brief comments from Julian Comrie on the photographic techniques of the period.

When clearing his parents' house some ten years ago, David found a box of photographs on 2"*2" glass and a log book recording a church trip his greatgrandfather Tommy Lenton made to Egypt, Palestine and Lebanon in 1912. The passport for this trip, obtained from Lord Grey (foreign secretary at the time) states as *Purpose of Trip* "Travels in the Ottoman Dominions".

Julian has kindly and carefully digitised the slides to make them accessible. The log book has some interesting and amusing snippets and Julian has some good historical information on the photographic techniques and equipment of the time.

NCS meetings are held at **8:00pm** in the Village Hall on the third Wednesday of each month. Refreshments from **7:30pm**. Annual membership of £5 includes admission to talks, discussions and refreshments. Visitors (who pay a small entrance charge), new or established members are all welcome.


