ANNUAL PARISH MEETING (APM): A reminder that this year's APM will take place at 7:30pm on Wednesday 2nd May in the Village Hall. Please do come along and hear what's been going on in your Parish and what is planned for the future, it's an ideal chance to put your views across.

WANT TO SPEND SOME MONEY IMPROVING THE PARISH?

Suggestions for how you would like the Parish Council to improve the Parish using the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL - grants received as a result of development) will be sought at the APM. The grants are intended to "support the development of the Parish area, or any part of that area, by funding the provision, improvement, replacement, operation or maintenance of infrastructure; or anything else that is concerned with addressing the demands that development places on an area". They have already been used to help fund such things as the White St. Sports Field car park extension, work to the school library to provide more teaching space and even the White St. litter bin, so please give this some thought and bring your ideas along to the APM (or send them in advance to the Clerk if you are unable to attend).

TRACTOR REPORT: Don't forget that this can be viewed on the North Curry website or obtained from the Parish Office. Cllr. Stone would like to receive comments both of support of the approach, confirmation that the main issues are covered and comment on areas that have been missed, areas you disagree with etc. All feedback would be appreciated to prove the validity of the report and the concerns raised.

EASIER ACCESS ON FOOTPATHS: Four new kissing gates are to be installed in order to improve access to footpaths. Our grateful thanks go to the landowners, Mr and Mrs Bennett and Mrs de Silva for their co-operation in facilitating this and to Becky and Steve Watts of Loscombe Meadow who kindly paid for one of the gates.

VOLUNTEER DRIVERS NEEDED: SCC need more volunteer drivers to help people get to medical appointments, day care centres, schools etc. Drivers need to be over 18, have a four-door car, a current driving licence and commit to as little as one hour per week. 

SNOW! I was so sorry to have to cancel the March produce market but safety first.


I am looking forward to a busy market on 7^{th} April. We have New Stalls and New Staff.

Cancelled March concert

Tickets returned to the Post Office will be refunded; any monies not reclaimed will be used to defray expenses incurred by the church on printing and licensing.

Rogation Procession

Advance notice: On Sunday 13th May, Athelney Benefice will be a celebrating our agricultural heritage and giving recognition to our responsibilities as stewards of creation. The event will take the form of a Rogation Procession between the four parish churches, stopping at each to ask for God's blessing on the land and fellowship between neighbours. The day will start at 8 o'clock with Eucharist at North Curry parish church, and on at 11:00am for a short service of Rogation Praise at Stoke St. Gregory parish church, and special Rogation Eucharist at Burrowbridge church at 1:00pm. Then we will visit the Athelney memorial (park in the farmyard) at 3:15pm for a blessing on the whole Benefice and end at 4:30pm with a short service at Lyng church celebrating Life's Journey.

Times are approximate, and we ask for tolerance if we keep anyone waiting! Dogs are welcome but must be kept on lead at all times. Children are welcome, but must be accompanied by a responsible adult.

On Sunday 13th May we shall be holding our eighth annual Coast to Coast Cycle Challenge, starting at 11:00am in Watchet and ending in West Bay.

In 2017, 580 supporters took part in this event to help raise funds to keep Dorset and Somerset Air Ambulance flying and in doing so collaboratively rode just over 30,600 miles (that's approximately 35 journeys from Land's End to John O' Groats!) and raised more than £79,000 – that's enough to fund approximately 26 missions by the air ambulance.

This event is not a race and involves cycling along some of Dorset and Somerset's glorious countryside, riding through picturesque villages, with a mix of quiet back roads and busier main interspersed with roads. some demanding climbs and hairy descents this challenge definitely offers something for everyone!

We are aware that this event may cause you and your neighbours some slight disruption as the route will be coming through North Curry via 13 Bends, Borough Post and Oxen Lane and we would like to apologise in advance for any inconvenience caused.

The Royal British Legion



Farming News

The next few months start to see a bit of greenery. Spring is on its way, what a wonderful time of year, it picks you up after the winter blues. Farmers are gearing up for one of the most stressful and busiest times of year. Dung is spread on fields; crops and grass are fertilized; fencing and gates are checked and repaired and you will start to see more and more cattle grazing as the months go on and the ground begins to dry out. Grass silage will be cut and clamped during May and ploughing/cultivating the ground for maize drilling and other spring crops will begin. This all means there will be several long days for the tractors on the roads and possible night work, as all this is so weather dependent. In the meantime let's hope this cold spell doesn't hurt the lovely buds beginning to form on shrubs and trees and lets all enjoy the beautiful daffodils, crocuses, snowdrops and hyacinths that are a welcome sight this time of year.
