The Greenhouse Effect, Climate Change, **Bees and You!**



On Wednesday 16th May we welcome Alex Morrice to talk about the Greenhouse Effect and measuring changes in the natural world. He will look at the impact of climate change on gardens, wildlife and wine making, with a particular focus on the honey bee to illustrate the consequences for an ecosystem. Alex promises that there is one slide that explains the difference between climate and weather - probably worth coming for that alone!

Alex, a bee keeping North Curry resident, formerly of Stoke, served in the Royal Navy for almost 30 years, Director including as of Naval Oceanography and Meteorology, before retiring in the rank of Captain in 1992.

Maypoles and Mischief, Merrymaking and Mayhem – a history of May Celebrations

May is a special time of the year, a time for celebrations and fairs, and for revels, riots, dancing and protest. In preparation for our own May Fair, this talk looks at the social history of May celebrations and the importance of Mayday, Whitsun and Summer Games. Richly accompanied with illustrations, recorded and live music, the talk traces how May festivities have changed and adapted through the ages, how the idea of 'may' is expressed in literature and folk song and some of the battles fought over how we celebrate. A special focus will be traditions and stories of celebrations in Somerset.

The talk is given by local musician Tim Hill. Tim has been creating and researching outdoor celebrations and music for other 25 years. He regularly talks at universities, colleges and arts conferences, and, with the Mellstock band, recreates the rural music of eighteenth and nineteenth century England, playing and appearing in radio, TV and film productions like the classic BBC Pride and Prejudice and recent Tess of the D'Urbervilles.

Recycling more & wasting less

Dave Mansell from Wiveliscombe will be talking in the Williams Hall, Stoke St Gregory on 24th May at 7:45 on how recycling has increased in Somerset, how more could be recycled and what else should be done to decrease waste and use natural resources better, including through a circular economy.

Dave has been involved in developing pioneering new recycling services in the UK since 1989 and throughout Somerset since 2003. He worked as Development and Monitoring Manager at Somerset Waste Partnership until last year, when he took early retirement. He was a founder of Wivey Action on Climate & Environment in 2014, is a town councillor in Wiveliscombe and has just been elected as the only Green Party Councillor on Taunton Deane Borough Council. Do come along - all are welcome; no doubt there will be a lively discussion afterwards.

RENEWABLE ENERGY IN NORTH CURRY As many of you will remember an informal group known as **North Curry Community Energy** was formed in 2015, seeking to install PV panels on public buildings in North Curry. In due course they were installed on the White Street Pavilion, School and Village Hall in 2016, following a community fund raising effort by Brendon Energy.

Two years on, we are very pleased to say that comparisons of electricity bills show that the **school is saving around £1800 per annum**. This is in addition to receipts of over £300 per annum through the Feed In Tariff and for electricity exported to the grid. Savings for the Hall and White Street Sports have been less owing to the nature of those buildings' usage. However, between the three, there has been an impressive saving of over 36 tonnes of CO² in just over two years; this is the equivalent of around **113 barrels of crude oil or 11 tonnes of coal so far.** Contact: Brian on 490623 or email <code>bandk@bkjeanes.co.uk</code>
