**ROAD CLOSURES - THE SHAMBLES AND WEST SEDGEMOOR ROAD:** Please note that The Shambles will be closed for four weeks from 15<sup>th</sup> October. Please be particularly considerate how you park in Queen Square during this time as large vehicles may struggle to turn west out of it during this period.

Also, West Sedgemoor Road will be closed from 8<sup>th</sup> October for 5 days from the junction with Langport Road northwards for 500 metres.
